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INTRODUCTION

The **Article Writing Competition** organized by the **Royal College of Pharmaceutical Education and Research** in association with **Academic Decipher** is a national-level event aimed at fostering research and innovation among students in the pharmaceutical sciences. The competition's theme, "*Innovative Drug Delivery Systems and Technologies*," focuses on advancing the understanding of modern drug delivery methods, a crucial area in pharmaceutical development. This event provides students with a platform to explore these innovative systems and present their ideas in a structured academic environment.

The competition welcomes participants from diverse educational backgrounds, including PhD, Postgraduate, Degree, and Diploma students. Conducted in a **hybrid mode**—both online and offline—the competition allows students from across the country to engage, collaborate, and share their knowledge. The two-round structure, consisting of article submissions and presentations, not only evaluates the students' research skills but also tests their ability to present and defend their work in a competitive academic setting.

By partnering with **Academic Decipher**, the competition ensures a high level of academic integrity and exposure. The best submissions will be published as book chapters with an ISBN, giving students an opportunity for wider recognition. This event aligns with the Royal College of Pharmaceutical Education and Research's mission of nurturing future pharmacists by encouraging innovation, critical thinking, and professional growth.



OBJECTIVES

1. Promote Research and Innovation

Encourage students to explore new and innovative drug delivery systems and technologies, enhancing their research and analytical skills.

2. Foster Academic Writing

Develop students' ability to write well-structured academic articles, improving their communication of complex ideas in a professional manner.

3. Encourage Collaboration

Provide a platform for teamwork by requiring multi-author submissions, fostering collaboration among students and their academic mentors.

4. Enhance Presentation Skills

Offer an opportunity for students to present their research findings, helping them build confidence in delivering and defending their ideas.

5. Provide National Exposure

Create a national-level platform where students can showcase their work, gain recognition, and learn from their peers across various institutions.

6. Support Publication Opportunities

Promote high-quality submissions by offering selected articles the opportunity to be published as book chapters with an ISBN, giving students exposure in the academic community.

EVENT DETAILS

1. Mode of Competition:

The Article Writing Competition was conducted in a **hybrid mode**—both online and offline. This allowed participation from students across the country, providing flexibility for those who preferred virtual engagement.

2. Dates and Timelines:

- Registration: 20th to 28th August 2024
- Article Submission: 10th to 15th September 2024
- Round 1 Result Announcement: 1st October 2024
- Round 2 Presentations:
 - Offline: 21st October 2024
 - Online: 10th October 2024
- Prize Distribution: 21st October 2024

3. Eligibility:

The competition was open to students from PhD, Postgraduate, Degree, and Diploma programs, across all years of study in any stream.

4. Registration fees:

- **Offline Participants:** ₹150 per student
 - **Online Participants:** ₹50 per student
- (There was no fee for guides, supervisors, or principals.)

5. Rounds of Competition

- **Round 1:** Submitted articles (in PDF format) were evaluated based on content, presentation, and adherence to the theme.



- **Round 2:** The top 20 participants presented their articles either offline or online. Each presentation was followed by a question-and-answer session.
- **Presentation Time:** 15 minutes per group, with 2 additional minutes for questions.

6. Venue for Offline Participants:

Offline presentations took place at the seminar hall of the Royal College of Pharmaceutical Education and Research, Malegaon. Online presentations were conducted via Google Meet.

RULES AND EVALUATION CRITERIA

1. Team Composition:

Each article was required to have a minimum of three student authors. In addition, the guide/supervisor and the principal were also listed as authors. Only one student from the group handled registration for the entire team.

2. Submission Guidelines:

- Articles were written in English, using A4 size MS Word format, with **Times New Roman** font.
- Font sizes: **10** for text and **12** for headings.
- Headings were bold and in uppercase. Subheadings were bold but not uppercase. Sub-subheadings were numbered.

3. Anonymity:

To ensure unbiased evaluation, the name of the college, city, state, guide, principal, and participants were not mentioned in the article. Authors were not prefixed with titles like Mr./Mrs./Dr./Prof.

4. Rounds

- **Round 1:** Articles were evaluated in PDF format based on content, clarity, and adherence to guidelines.
- **Round 2:** The top 20 participants were invited to present their articles online or offline.

5. Evaluation Criteria

The evaluation was based on the following criteria:

- **Depth and quality of content** – 20 marks
- **Correctness of references and citation style** – 20 marks
- **Clarity of tables and figures** – 20 marks



- **Presentation style** – 10 marks
- **Question-answer session** – 10 marks (in Round 2)
- 10 marks were deducted if the identity of the authors was revealed.

6. Publication

Selected high-quality articles were published as book chapters with an ISBN.

Separate publication charges are applied.

7. Prizes

- 1st Prize: ₹5000
- 2nd Prize: ₹3000
- 3 Consolidation Prizes: ₹1000 each

8. Certificates

E-certificates were provided to all participants and their guides after the declaration of results.
